A giant beanstalk had grown!
6. Who came into the room?
An enormous giant came into the room.

Jack sold the cow.

4. What did Jack see once he climbed to the top of the beanstalk?
When Jack finally reached the top, he saw an enormous castle.
5. What did the giant shout when he came into the room?
He shouted, "Fee, Fi, Fo, Fum, I smell the blood of an Englishman!"

His mother was angry because Jack only got magic beans in exchange for their cow when they needed money.
 4. Where did the beanstalk grow?
A giant beanstalk had grown in the garden outside Jack's window.
 5. How can you tell the beanstalk was high?
It was so tall, it went right up to the sky and through the clouds!
 6. What was the giant's catchphrase?
"Fee, Fi, Fo, Fum, I smell the blood of an Englishman!"

7. How did the giant find out about Jack?
As he ran, the harp cried, "Help master!" and the giant woke up.
 8. Describe how you think the giant's egg looked using three adjectives.
**(Answers will vary - accept any 3 reasonable adjectives to describe the golden egg.)
E.g. I think the egg looked golden, shiny and smooth.**
 9. Who saved the day and how?
Jack's mother because she came out with an axe, used it to chop the bottom of the beanstalk and the giant fell and crashed to the ground.
 10. Do you think it was a happy ending for everyone?
**(Answers will vary for the giant – it could be sad or a mystery as he was never seen again.)
It was happy for Jack and his mother because they lived happily ever after with the golden eggs and the magic harp. It was not happy for the giant because he fell, crashed to the ground and was never seen again.**
