

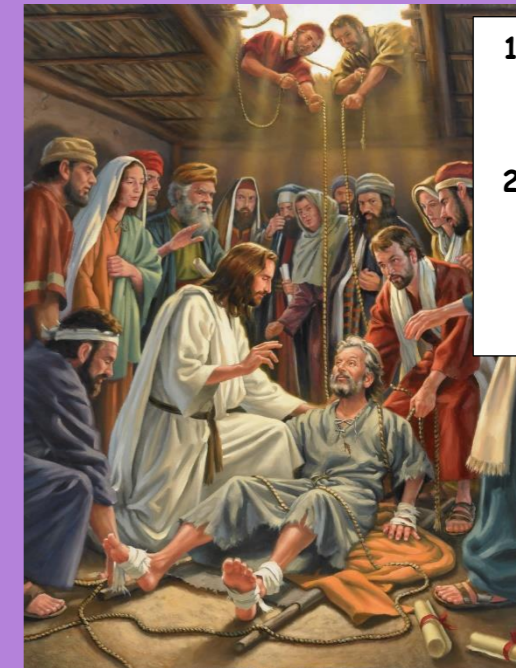
Lent: Year 3

3. How did Jesus change the lives of the people who witnessed this miracle by bringing the man back to life?

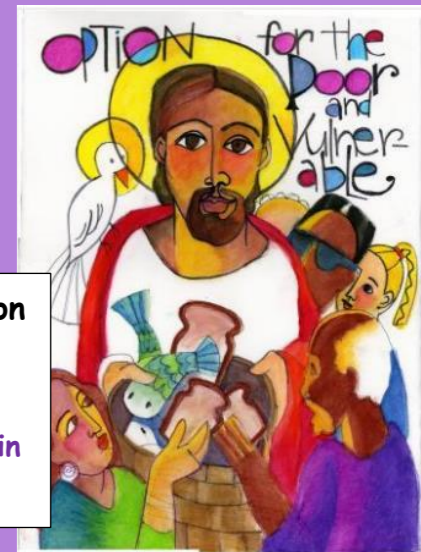


1. What can we learn from the story of the Paralyse Man?

Lent	a time of preparation before Easter - we remember Jesus spending 40 days and nights fasting in the desert
change	to transform and become different
miracle	an unusual event that is believed to be caused by the power of God
Widow of Nain	a lady who asked for Jesus to perform a miracle when her son passed away
paralysed man	he could not move until Jesus forgave his sins, then he could walk again
Ash Wednesday	Holy day marking the beginning of Lent
sorrow	a feeling of deep sadness or regret
forgiveness	letting go of negative feelings
