Nursery Maths Timetable

Activity	Shape, Space and Measure Watch, sing and join in with the actions for the 'Circle Song' on website: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LIXnXf6FSq8 Go on a shape hunt around your house, can you find any circles? E.g. clock, mirror, biscuits, coins etc. Adult to use paper and scissors to cut out circle shapes, which will be used to make a caterpillar. Ask what shapes am I making? It is a circle. It is round. What is it like? It is like a pizza, a biscuit etc. Tip: if you fold the paper a few times and cut out one circle you will be a cutting out a few circles at a time. Save one of the circles to draw the caterpillar's face. Line up or stick together all the circle shapes in a line. Can you make a long caterpillar body? How many circles did you use? Can you make a short caterpillar body? How many circles did you use? 	Counting 2 Numberblocks- 'Another One' Watch 'Numberblocks' episode 'Another One' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08c001f/numberblocks-series-1-another-one During this episode two is made by combining one and another one. Practise using the language of 'combining' using everyday objects e.g. one apple and another apple is two apples. Also in this episode two is 'partitioned' into one and another one. Practise using the language of partitioning using two everyday objects e.g. two pencils is one pencil and another pencil.	Counting 2 Numberblocks- 'Another One' Encourage your child to be a 'Two Detective'. Go on a hunt around the house for items that are a set of two e.g. pair of socks, pair of shoes, pair of wellies, a pair of gloves etc. Gather up a collection of family member's clean socks and mix them up. Ask your child to sort them into twos.	Counting 2 Numberblocks- 'Another One' Have fun counting with actions. Ask your child to do: 2 jumps 2 claps 2 stamps 2 star jumps 2 hops You could make up some other actions. You could video your child and watch it back together. Ask questions How many claps did you do? Combining language: one jump and another jump is two jumps. Partitioning language: two jumps is one jump and another jump.	Counting 2 Numberblocks- 'Another One' On paper make a set of number 2 flash cards and hide them around the house (or outdoors) Go on a number 2 hunt and see if you can find all the number twos that you have hidden. Print out a colouring picture of the Numberblocks character 'Number 2' from website: https://www.coloringonly.com/pages/Numberblocks-2 Or have a go at drawing two blocks. Ask your child to colour the character 'Number Two' in orange. Have a go at writing the number 2.
