Nursery Maths Timetable

Activity	One, Two, Three! Watch 'Numberblocks' episode 'One, Two, Three!' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08bzh11/numberblocks-series-1-one-two-three In this episode One, Two and Three compare themselves with respect to their heights using the language of 'bigger than' and 'biggest'. They also use the language of ordinal numbers first, second and third. Pause the episode and look closely at One, Two and Three. Model and encourage your child to use a stem sentence to capture the relationships: Two is bigger than One. Three is the biggest. One is first. Two is second. Three is third. Draw and colour One, Two and Three characters and practise saying the stem sentences.	One, Two, Three! Use 3 plastic cups and make a colour label or character label for each cup 1,2,3.  Ask your child to close their eyes. Adult to hide an object under one of the cups. Child to open their eyes and guess which number cup the object is hiding under. Encourage your child to talk in full sentences e.g. "The apple is under cup 1." or "The apple is under the first cup." Reveal the hidden object. Now it's your child's turn to hide the object. Repeat with different numbers each time. Include a window, a tree and a room e.g. 1 room, 1 tree in the garden, 1 window and number 1 on the door. Say stem sentence "I can see two windows. Include the windows, trees and rooms e.g. 2 rooms, 2 trees in the garden, 2 windows and number 2 on the door	The Three Little Pigs Rewatch 'Numberblocks' episode 'The Three Little Pigs' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08cqtK0/numberblocks-series-1-three-little-pigs Pause the episode and look at the third house in detail. Say stem sentence "I can see three flags; I can see number 3 on the door" etc. Third Little Pig On paper draw the Numberblocks 'Three Little Pigs' house for the third little pig. Include the windows, trees and rooms e.g. 3 rooms, 3 trees in the garden, 3 windows and number 3 on the door, 3 turrets and 3 flags.
