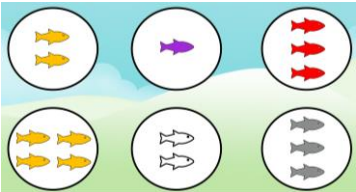
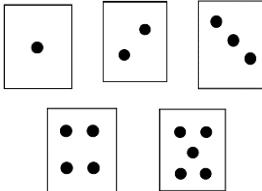
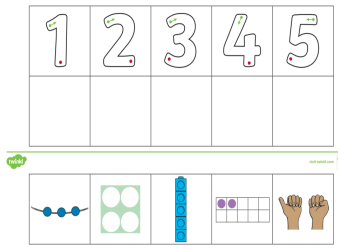




Please find below our suggested Maths daily timetable, we hope you find it useful. We appreciate and are fully aware that families can only do their best with the technology and resources they have available.

Activity	Number Bonds to 5 Watch Numberblocks episode 'Hide and Seek' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08dmn88/numberblocks-series-1-hide-and-seek During this episode the Numberblocks show us that one and four combine to make five. Two and three combine to make five. We also see that five can partition into one and four, or two and three. Play a 'Hide and Seek' game like the Numberblocks. Adult to count to ten and child hides. Child to count to ten, saying the number names in the correct sequence and adult to hide.	Addition to 5  Draw a set of circles and objects that when added together make 5 e.g. sets of fish as above. 3 and 2 makes 5. Draw lines to show all the number bonds to 5. Adult to model and use stem sentence to describe the combining of the parts to make 5. <i>One and Four together make 5. Two and three together make 5 etc.</i>	Numberblocks 'Number Magic' Adding and Subtracting  Play adding and subtracting game on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/puzzles/numberblocks-number-magic-adding-and-subtracting	Subitising to 5 (This means your child instantly recognises the quantity and doesn't have to count) Use or make your own spot cards to practise subitising.  Play subitising flash card game. Hide the cards behind your back and reveal each card. Your child can shout out the numbers each time. When your child is more confident with subitising encourage them to use these stem sentences: <i>I see 1 spot. I know it is 3 because there are 3 spots etc. I know it's 4 because it's one less than 3. I know it's 5 because it's one more than 4.</i>	Number formation to 5 Practise writing the numerals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Find the picture that represents the numbers 1 to 5 and match it to the number. See larger version below Number Formation and Representation 1 to 5 Activity Practise forming the numerals 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Then, find the picture which represents the number and match it to the numeral.

Number Formation and Representation 1 to 5 Activity

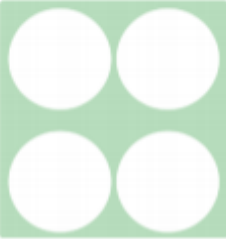
Practise forming the numerals 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Then, find the picture which represents the number and match it to the numeral.
