Nursery Maths Timetable

Activity	Five Watch 'Numberblocks' episode 'Five' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08d630h/numberblocks-series-1-five In this episode One and Four combine to make Five. Ask your child how was Five made? Model and encourage your child to use a stem sentence to capture the relationship between Four and Five: One and four together make five. Comparative relationship between Four and Five: Five is one more than four. Four is one less than five. Five sings about things that are found in fives: 5 pointed star, 5 fingers on one hand, 5 seats in a car, 5 people in the band etc. Give each other a high five, to the side, up above and down below. Draw around your child's hand and cut it out. Count how many fingers/thumb and write numbers 1,2,3,4 and 5 on each finger.	Five Use a bowl or basket and ask your child to touch count four things into the bowl e.g. 4 apples. Ask your child: How many things are in the bowl? Next ask your child to show you how many things are in the bowl by using their fingers to show the answer 4. Ask your child to put one more object e.g. apple in. Ask your child How many now? Repeat with different objects. This activity demonstrates how to count on from 4. Next your child will learn how to partition 5 into 1 and 4. Use two plates and 5 objects. Put one object on one plate and four objects on the other plate. Use stem sentence: One and Four together make five. Repeat with: Four and One together make Five.	Five Sing and watch 'Five Little Ducks' on website: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=x-KQvzuxtMc Pause and check how many ducks there are each time. Encourage your child to subitise. This means your child instantly recognises the quantity and doesn't have to count. On paper make your own set of 5 ducklings and a mummy duck. Practise singing the rhyme and learning to subitise each set.	Five On paper make a set of number 5 flash cards and hide them around the house (or outdoors) Go on a number 5 hunt and see if you can find all the number fives that you have hidden. Watch 'Numberblocks' song 'Five' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/numberblocks-the-five-song Have a go at drawing character Number 'Five' or draw his 5 blocks. Ask your child to colour in the character 'Five' in blue. Have a go at writing the number 5.	Five Watch Numberblocks episode 'Off We Go' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08cr0y7/numberblocks-series-1-off-we-go Practise singing and saying the number names in the right order. Use number cards or Numberblock character pictures made previously and jumble them up and put them in the wrong order. Ask your child to re-order them in the correct order. Once the numbers are ordered ask your child to close their eyes and remove a number. Which number is missing? Repeat with different number missing each time.
