Nursery Maths Timetable

Activity	Ordering by Size Sing 'The Goldilocks Song' from website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-when-goldilocks-went-to-the-house-of-the-bears/zbkrf4j Print and cut out templates of 3 different size bowls, chairs and beds from website: https://www.themailbox.com/magazines/math-patterns-ordering-by-size/goldilocks-story-props If you don't have access to a printer then you can use everyday objects from home e.g. spoons, cups, books etc. to sort into three groups. Use size vocabulary: big, biggest, small, smallest and middle-sized.	Counting 1 Attach the number one to a single unit. Watch 'Numberblocks' video clip 'The Number One' song on CBeebies website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/numberblocks-the-one-song Go on a hunt around the house (or outdoors) and make a collection of 1 unit items e.g. collect 1 pencil, 1 apple, 1 cup, 1 toy, 1 sweet 1 flower. Look at your 1 collection. Encourage your child to use this sentence to talk about a single unit e.g. "I see one apple."	Counting 1 Attach the number one to a single unit. Sing song One Finger, One Thumb (Keep Moving) 'from website: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1bmT6RMNQD8 Create a 'One Wonderful World' display by making a record of your 1 unit items. Your child could draw a picture of each item, take a photograph or paint a picture of each item. Remember to use the sentence "I see one..." as you go along.	Counting 1 Attach the number one to a single unit. Have fun counting with actions. Ask your child to do: 1 jump 1 clap 1 stamp 1 star jump 1 hop 1 big smile. You could make up some other action. You could video your child and watch it back together. Ask questions How many claps did you do?	Counting 1 Recognise number one. Make a set of number one flash cards and hide them around the house (or outdoors) Go on a number one hunt and see if you can find all the number ones that you have hidden. Print out a colouring picture of the Numberblocks character 'Number 1' from website: https://www.funhousetoys.org/numberblocks Ask your child to colour the character 'Number One' in red. Have a go at writing the number one.

Other Maths Ideas

Sing our class 'Days of the Week' song to the tune of the 'Addams Family', Website: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HtQcnZ2JWsY>
