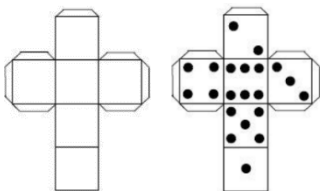
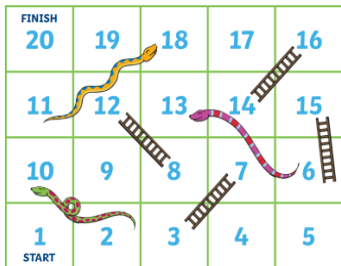
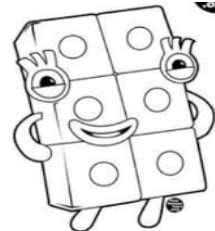




Please find below our suggested Maths daily timetable, we hope you find it useful. We appreciate and are fully aware that families can only do their best with the technology and resources they have available.

Activity	Six Watch Numberblocks episode 'Six' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08pgksd/numberblocks-series-2-six During this episode the Numberblocks make a new friend. They find a wooden cube with dots on, one side has more dots than they count. Five and One make number magic and make Six. Six tells her new friends about dice and how to play games. During the episode watch and sing 'Six in the Mix' song. Make a dice and draw the sets of spots ready to use for a game tomorrow. (See templates below) 	Six Play a simple game of snakes and ladders (See templates below) using the dice you made yesterday or a dice you have at home. Snakes and Ladders  When you roll the dice practise subitising each time (this means your child instantly recognises the quantity and doesn't have to count) Move that many places on the board. Remember its up a ladder and down a snake.	Subitising to 6 Use or make your own spot cards to practise subitising (This means your child instantly recognises the quantity and doesn't have to count)  Play subitising flash card game. Hide the cards behind your back and reveal each card. Your child can shout out the numbers each time. When your child is more confident with subitising encourage them to use these stem sentences: I see 3 spots without counting. I know it is 3 because there are 3 spots etc. I know it's 3 because it's one less than 4. I know its 3 because it's one more than 2.	Six Have fun counting with actions. Ask your child to do: 6 jumps 6 claps 6 stamps 6 star jumps 6 hops You could make up some other actions. You could video your child and watch it back together. Ask questions How many claps did you do?	Six On paper make a set of number 6 flash cards and hide them around the house (or outdoors) Go on a number 6 hunt and see if you can find all the number sixes that you have hidden. Print out a colouring picture of the Numberblocks character 'Number 6' or have a go at drawing six blocks. Ask your child to colour the character 'Number Six' in purple. Have a go at writing the number 6.
