Nursery Maths Timetable

Activity	Two Numberblocks- 'Everything is Better with Two'. Watch 'Numberblocks' episode 'Two' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08bzgt8/numberblocks-series-1-two During this episode Two finds a pair of magic dancing shoes and shows One that everything is better with two. Singing and counting things that belong in pairs. In this episode it provides examples of things that come in ones and twos. There are lots of examples of twos e.g. dancing together, riding a tandem, setting a table for two. By providing examples of one alongside, your child will distinguish what two is and what two is not. During the episode or in daily life encourage your child to say... "I have two..." "I have one..." Draw around your hands and feet on paper and say "I have two hands. I have two feet." Look in the mirror, notice and say "I have one nose, I have two eyes."	Meet Three Numberblocks- 'Three is one more than Two. Watch 'Numberblocks' episode 'Three' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08bzgxx/numberblocks-series-1-three In this episode children meet 'Three'. It shows the part-part-whole structure of 3: combining 2 with 1 to make 3. Read and count a variety of stories that have 3 characters in it. - Recap on the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears. - The Three Little Pigs. - The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Draw a picture of the 3 characters from the story each time.	Meet Three Numberblocks- 'Three is one more than Two. During the episode yesterday your child experienced 3 in relationship to 2 and 1. Encourage your child to use a stem sentence below to capture this relationship. Gather sets of 3 everyday objects e.g. sweets, crayons, fruit etc. Use a set of the same objects and use mathematical language as you count and say the stem sentence e.g. "One apple and two apples together makes three apples." Then say "Two apples and one apple together make three apples." Repeat with different sets of objects. Record the sets by drawing the objects on paper.	Meet Three Numberblocks- 'Three is one more than Two. On paper make a set of number 3 flash cards and hide them around the house (or outdoors) Go on a number 3 hunt and see if you can find all the number threes that you have hidden. Watch 'Numberblocks' song 'Three' on website: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/numberblocks-the-three-song Have a go at drawing number 'Three' or his 3 blocks. Ask your child to colour in the character 'Three' in yellow. Have a go at writing the number 3.	Bank Holiday VE Day Celebrations
