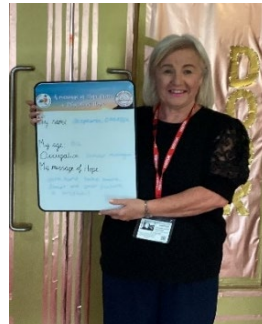
Claire – Building for a Better Tomorrow

Stephanie – Furniture with a Purpose

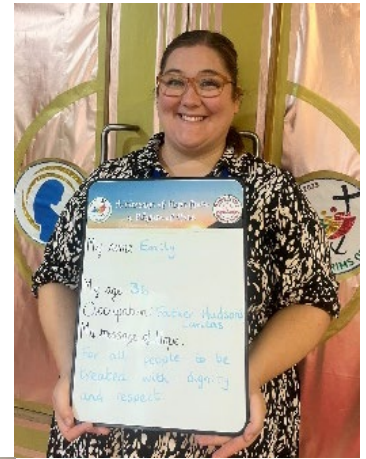

NURSERY

Religious Education

In RE the children listened to the Bible story 'The Wedding at Cana' and were amazed by Jesus' first miracle. They know that people get married when they love each other. The children enjoyed dressing up in special clothes and role-playing a wedding celebration.



Understanding the World

This week the children continue to learn about how plants grow. They couldn't believe their eyes to find a magic beanstalk growing in the nursery classroom! Religious Education

We had a wonderful workshop this week where we invited our family members to come and celebrate St. Anne, Mary and Jubilee year of Hope. We created some special crowns to represent Mary the Queen of Peace, wrote our own messages of hope to add to our hope tree and created wonderful artwork to remember Saint Anne. We have also been busy this week by role playing a Baptism in our outdoor Prayer Garden. We worked together to recreate the special moments during a Baptism and enjoyed welcoming baby Anne into the family of God.



Maths

We have been busy exploring number stories linked to numbers to ten. We used ten frames to tell a story using the vocabulary "first, then and now". The children worked hard to add characters to the bus using their super reliable counting and maths language.



Understanding the World – Plants

We have been learning all about plants. This week we started an experiment to see where plants will grow and flourish. We have placed plants in different areas to see which plant will grow the tallest. We are excited to see what happens and can't wait to let you know the results.

YEAR 1

Religious Education – The Prodigal Son

This week, we listened to the parable of the Prodigal Son and spent time reflecting on the choices he made throughout his journey. As we explored the story, we chose different words to describe the son at each stage. At the beginning, we used words like *selfish*, *careless*, and *greedy*. As the story progressed, we were glad to see the son change; he began to understand his mistakes and chose to return home to show his father how truly sorry he was. This helped us think of more positive qualities, such as *caring*, *faith-filled*, and *joyful*.

Through this story, we learned an important lesson: everyone makes mistakes sometimes, but when we are truly sorry and ask for forgiveness, God - just like the father in the parable - is always ready to welcome us back with love and open arms.

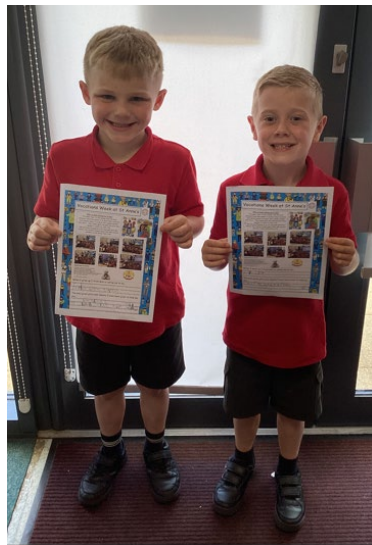


Personal Development – Vocations Week Reflection

Some of the children shared their thoughts:

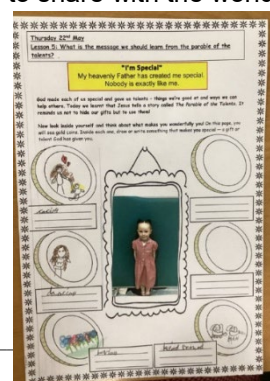
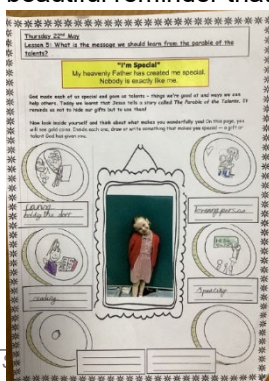
- Everley-Rose said she would like to become a teacher, and she believes that God has blessed her with the gift of kindness to help her in this role.

YEAR 2

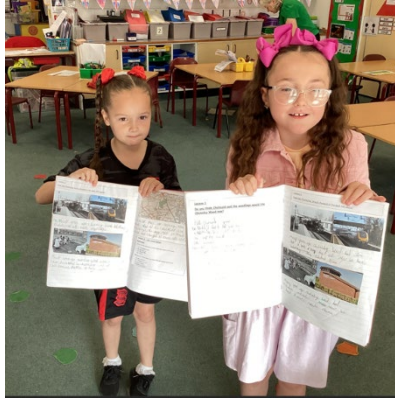
Religious Education

This week, Year 2 enjoyed a thoughtful and inspiring lesson on *The Parable of the Talents*. They learned that God made each of us unique and has given us special gifts and talents—things we’re good at and ways we can help others. Through Jesus’ story, they discovered the importance of using these gifts, not hiding them away! The children reflected on what makes them wonderfully *them*, and filled gold coins with drawings and words to celebrate the talents God has given them. What a beautiful reminder that we all have something valuable to share with the world!



History

This week, the children have been comparing Chelmsley Wood today and in the past 100 years. We have considered several aspects of our local history, including the amount of green space, how people used to play and how people used to get around.



YEAR 3

Religious Education

As part of our RE learning, Year 3 have been exploring the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We reflected on the Miracle of the Feeding of the 5,000 and how Jesus shared food with the crowd, showing love, care and generosity. This helped us understand the importance of sharing in our own lives and how this miracle links to the Blessed Sacrament. We learned that during the Eucharist, we remember Jesus' Last Supper and celebrate His presence with us in Holy Communion. The children thought deeply about how listening, sharing, and gathering together are all part of what makes the Eucharist so special.



Geography

As Geographers, we've been diving into the wonderful world of weather! We learned how meteorologists predict the weather and had a go at being weather presenters ourselves, reading forecasts, using weather symbols, and making our own predictions. We discovered why the UK's weather can change so quickly (it's all thanks to different air masses!) and even went outside to investigate what was happening in the sky above us. It's been a fun and fascinating journey through wind, rain, sunshine and more!



Celebration of the Word with Dan and Emily

Year 4 have been really enjoying joining in prayer with Dan and Emily each morning. They have been reflecting on Our Lady as we are in the month of May. We have loved singing hymns and joining in with special prayers each day.



History Enquiry Question – The Vikings

This week, the children have been answering the question: ‘The Vikings were not just bloodthirsty warriors’ What evidence do we have to support this view? The children discussed different factors such as; Danelaw and Danegeld, the invasion of Lindisfarne, King Alfred, Norse gods and King Canute. They then reached a conclusion to decide whether or not the Vikings were brutal fighters and raiders or skilled craftsmen and explorers.



RE Inspire Workshop – Pentecost

This week, Year 5 had their RE Inspire Workshop all about the season of Pentecost. The children and their parents and carers created the most beautiful art work all to do with the gift of the Holy Spirit. We thought about the blessings given by the Holy Spirit, and also how we can use these gifts during our special Jubilee Year. The creativity, spirituality and celebration of Pentecost was absolutely wonderful to see.



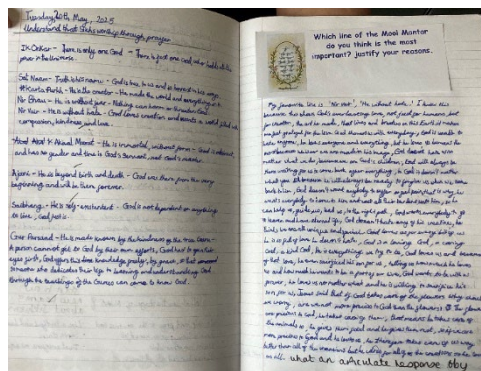
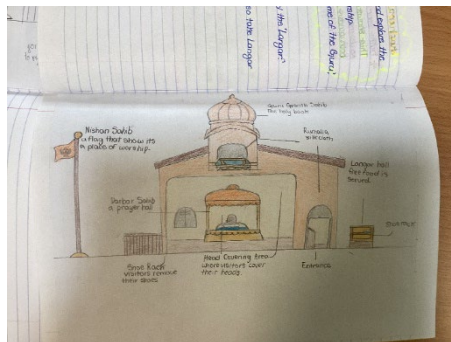
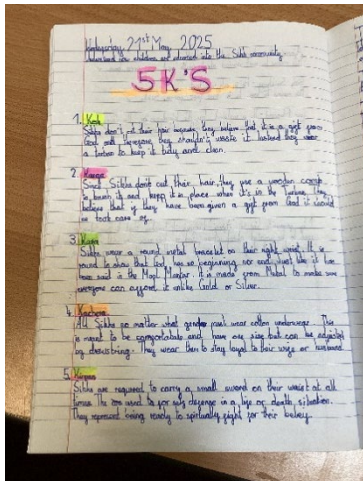
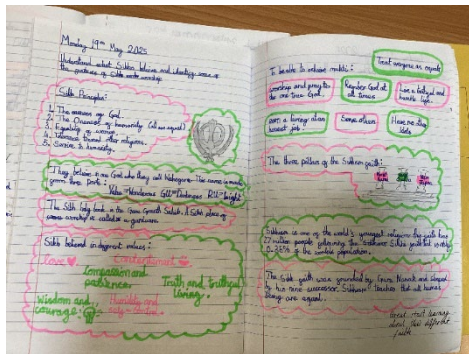

YEAR 6

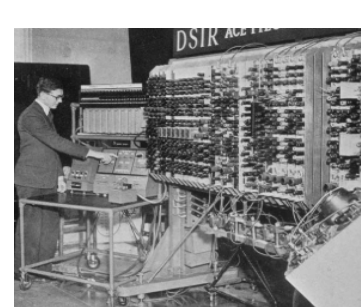
Religious Education

Year 6 explored the Sikh faith and its key beliefs and practices. We learned how Sikhism began with Guru Nanak and the importance of the ten Gurus and discussed how Sikhs pray and the role of the Guru Granth Sahib in worship. Pupils discovered the significance of the five articles of faith worn by Sikhs and explored the meaning of community kitchens and equality in Sikhism. The children showed great interest and respect while learning about this rich and deeply valued faith.



Maths

Year 6 have been learning all about famous mathematician, computer scientist and code-breaker, Alan Turing! We learnt that he is best known for his important role cracking German codes during the Second World War. The codebreaking operation, cracking "Enigma", is estimated to have shortened the Second World War by several years. We were inspired by his amazing intelligence and determination! We had a go cracking some maths related codes, pretending we were in Bletchley Park all those years ago!

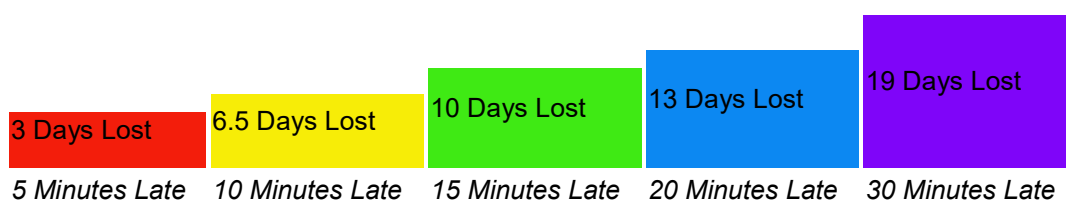
ATTENDANCE

Late marks and Absences

The doors open for children in Reception to Year 6 at **8.30am** and close at **8.40am**. Children who arrive after this time must go to the School Office where they will be given their late mark. Late marks are monitored and recorded. Children who arrive from 9.10am onwards are marked on the register as a 'U' for unauthorised absence, unless they are absent due to a medical appointment. Children arriving at the School Office prior to 9.10am will receive a late mark, 'L' on the register.

8.40am-9.10am = 'L', which means that your child receives a late mark. We are required to put a reason on the register for children who are late so office staff will always ask for a reason. If it is a personal/confidential reason please just say so; staff will make a note of this.

9.10am and beyond = 'U', which means the morning is recorded as an unauthorised absence

Attendance and Holidays –

Children Absent: If your child is absent from school it is necessary that you contact school on the first day of your child's absence. Contact 0121 779 8060 and choose option 1 before the start of the day. There is an answer phone facility for you to leave your child's name, class and reason for absence. Alternatively, you can email school with your child's reason of absence: parentmail@st-annes.solihull.sch.uk

Following previous correspondence, this reminds you again that all holidays are unauthorised and the Local Authority will fine parents regardless of when holidays are booked because the ruling has always been in place. This is a Local Authority decision; the School cannot over-ride their decision.
