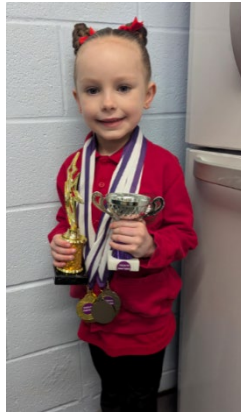
## ACTIVE HOMEWORK – WELL DONE CHILDREN!

**Celebration of the Word**

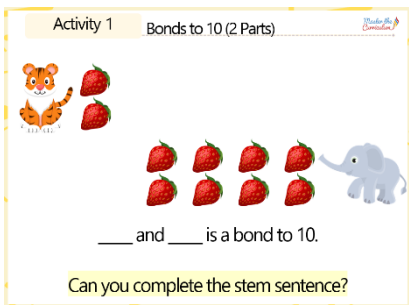

**YEAR 1**

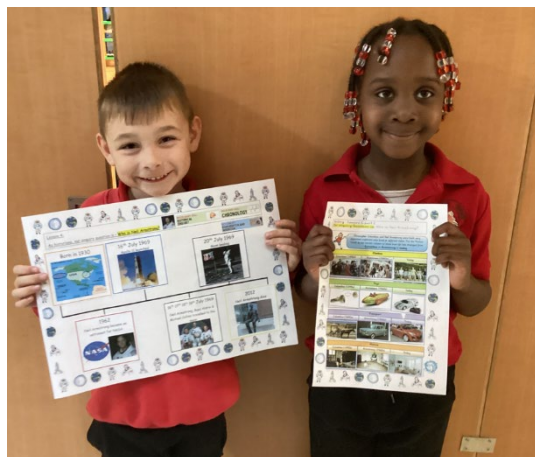
**RE – Stations of the Cross**

This week as Pilgrims of Hope, we went on a **pilgrimage** through the Stations of the Cross. At each station, we thought about how Jesus’ journey teaches us to be strong and trust in God. When He fell, He got back up—showing us to never give up. Kind people, like His mother, Simon, and Veronica, remind us to help others. Even when Jesus died, His love never ended. His resurrection gives us hope and joy. As we walked this pilgrimage, we remembered that Jesus is always with us, guiding us on our journey of faith and the sacrifice He made for us.



**History – Great Explorers**

As Historians we have continued our enquiry of great explorers. After learning all about Christopher Columbus, we have now turned our focus to Neil Armstrong. Once we learnt about his life and legacy, we created a timeline by correctly placing each event of Armstrong’s life into chronological order. We then used our prior knowledge of life in the 1400’s during Christopher Columbus’ time, and compared it to life in the 1900’s and life in our present day.



**YEAR 2**

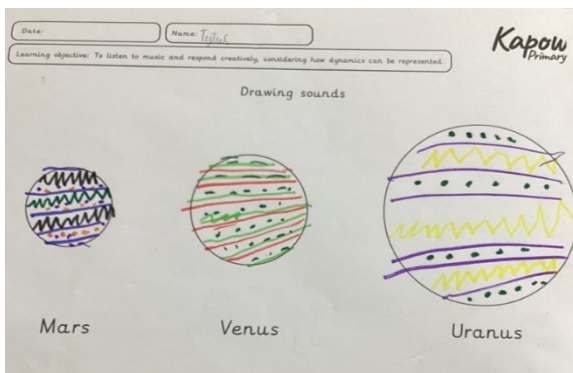
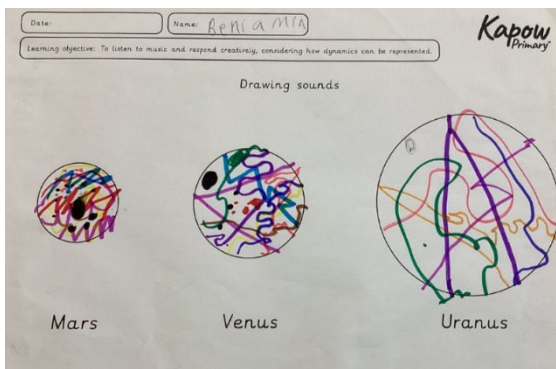
**RE- Stations of the Cross**

This week in RE, Year 2 walked the Stations of the Cross, reflecting on Jesus' journey to His death. We also celebrated the Jubilee of Hope, which encourages us to keep hope in our hearts, just like Jesus did. The children learned that Jesus never gave up, even in suffering, and that hope helps us through tough times. At each station, the children carried their companion Luce, a symbol of being Pilgrims of Hope, and opened an egg with a symbol representing the story. They also said a prayer to thank Jesus for His sacrifices. This activity helped them understand the importance of hope, trust in God, and love in our lives



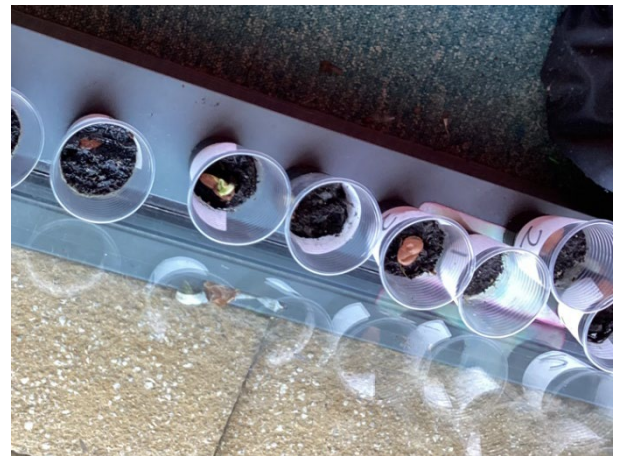
**Music**

## Science- Plant Update

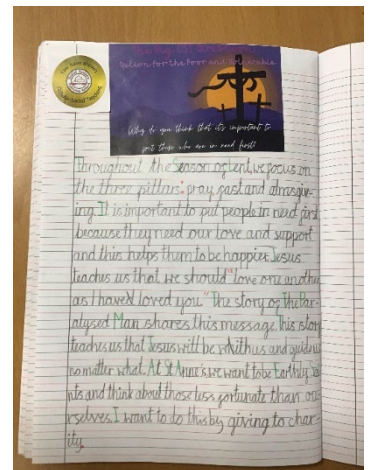

## YEAR 3

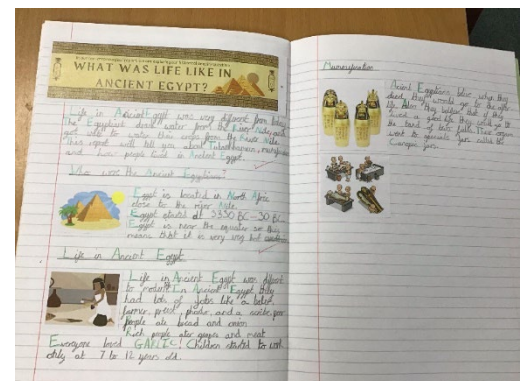
### Religious Education

This week, we took time to answer our Big Catholic Social Teaching question: *Why do you think that it's important to put those in need first during Lent?* We reflected on how Lent is a time to show love and care for others, especially those who are poor or vulnerable. Linking this to the CST principle of *Option for the Poor and Vulnerable*, we have learned that helping those in need is not just a good deed but a way of following Jesus' example of love and compassion.



### English/History – Non-fiction Writing

This week, Year 3 children have been busy writing their non-chronological reports in response to the historical enquiry question: *What was life like in Ancient Egypt?* We worked hard to organise our knowledge into clear and detailed reports, showcasing our understanding of this fascinating ancient civilisation. It was a fantastic way for us to bring history to life and share our discoveries with others!



## YEAR 4

### Religious Education – Stations of the Cross

Year 4 reflected upon the Stations of the Cross this week, we are preparing for the Holy Week and the coming of Christ.



**PE**

Year 4 have been enjoying their PE unit: Dance. We learnt about the origins of Samba music and how this links to the famous carnival in Rio De Janeiro in Brazil. We put different compositions together to Samba music. We also discussed what it means to be a good 'audience' and how this can help us with our listening skills.



**YEAR 5**

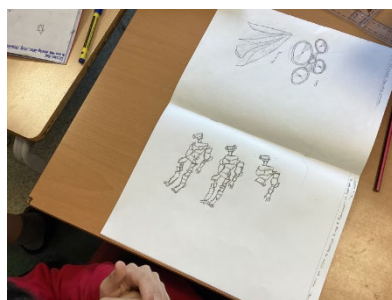
**Religious Education**

This week, in Religious Education, Year 5 have been creating some beautiful art work all to do with Lent. As we approach Holy Week and Easter, we thought that creating some art work would be a fantastic way to demonstrate our understanding. The children created some very unique pictures using oil pastels, creating an image of the Cross. Every piece of art work was different, which was beautiful. We loved seeing their brilliant work!



**Art and Design**

Year 5 have clearly been very artistic this week! To finish off our I Need Space unit in Art, all about retro futurism and the Space Race (yes – Art and History combined!) we put all of our knowledge together from our unit to create a final piece. This meant that the children chose something that they imagined would be in the world in 50 years time – for example a flying car or robots! Then, we created a repeated image in our sketch books. We certainly have super artists in Year 5!



**Religious Education**

The children in Year 6 spent some wonderful moments in reflection on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We thought about our Reconciliation Service with Deacon Stuart and how this helps prepare us for the Liturgical season in following Christ. We reflected on how the Sacrament of Reconciliation celebrates God's mercy and forgiveness. We wrote our own version of the Examination of Conscience and reflected on these questions.

Year 6 have been busy this week being active! 6N have had wonderful PE lessons developing their tennis skills, in particular the forehand ground stroke! 6M have been dancing away adapting the 'stamp and clap' sequence, focusing on changing dynamics and using space to elevate their routines!

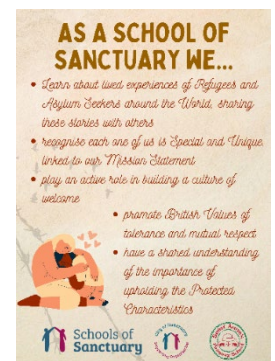
**SCHOOL OF SANCTUARY**

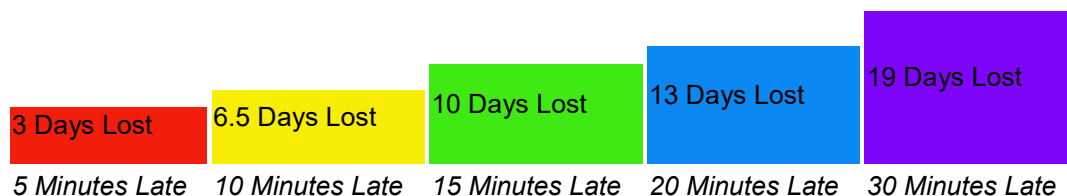
## ATTENDANCE

### Late marks and Absences

The doors open for children in Reception to Year 6 at **8.30am** and close at **8.40am**. Children who arrive after this time must go to the School Office where they will be given their late mark. Late marks are monitored and recorded. Children who arrive from 9.10am onwards are marked on the register as a 'U' for unauthorised absence, unless they are absent due to a medical appointment. Children arriving at the School Office prior to 9.10am will receive a late mark, 'L' on the register.

**8.40am-9.10am** = 'L', which means that your child receives a late mark. We are required to put a reason on the register for children who are late so office staff will always ask for a reason. If it is a personal/confidential reason please just say so; staff will make a note of this.

**9.10am and beyond** = 'U', which means the morning is recorded as an unauthorised absence



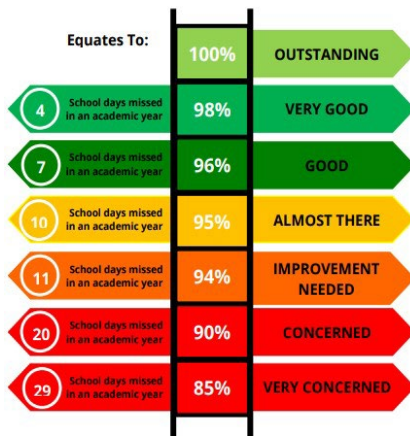
