FAMILY AND COMMUNITY

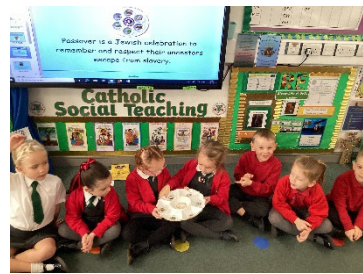

OTHER FAITH WEEK – YEAR 1 AND YEAR 4 – JUDAISM

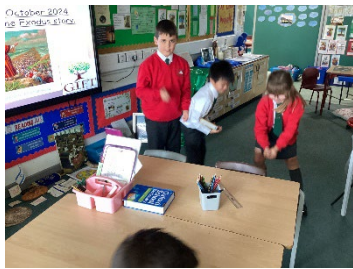
Year 1

This week, as part of our studies on different religions, in Year 1 and Year 4 we have been learning about Judaism. In Year 1, we explored key symbols of the Jewish faith, focusing especially on the Star of David and how its points represent different aspects of the religion. During our art lessons, we tried out pointillism and used this technique to decorate a Star of David with various patterns. We also learned about Hanukkah, the Jewish Festival of Lights, which commemorates a miracle that occurred in Jerusalem over 2,000 years ago. Together, we sequenced the Hanukkah story and explored how Jewish people celebrate this meaningful festival.



Year 4:

In Year 4, we explored the origins of Judaism, focusing on Abraham and Moses. The children learnt about Jewish festivals such as Passover and Sukkot, they learnt about the history and traditions of these. Using role play, the children re-enacted the story of Exodus in groups linked to the celebrations of Passover. We were also joined by a visitor from the local synagogue called Ruth who came to speak to the children about the Jewish faith. The children got the opportunity to ask questions, explore artefacts and find out more first-hand about Judaism. To finish the week, the children created their own version of the Ten Commandments!



THE YEAR OF PRAYER – OUR FATHER

In preparation for the 2025 Jubilee year of 'Pilgrims of Hope', this year has been designated as a Year of Prayer by Pope Francis. There is a particular focus on the Our Father, which we have been celebrating in different ways. Each class has been focusing on a different part of the prayer and we have also explored the prayer in different languages!

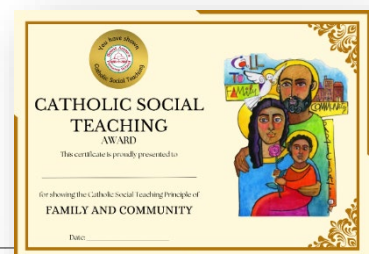

Applications for **Reception** and **Secondary** school places for September 2025 must be made via the Council Website: <http://www.solihull.gov.uk/admissions>. If you live outside Solihull you must apply to your local council even if you want to include Solihull schools on your application.

Information for our Year 6 Parents – applying for a Secondary School place for September 2025

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014 (current year 6) transfer to secondary school in September 2025. **Please ensure that you apply online before the closing date which is 31st October 2024. Offer day is 3rd March 2025.**

Submitting a late application will almost certainly affect the offer you will receive. Solihull residents should apply online via www.solihull.gov.uk; all other applicants must apply through their home authority.

Information for our Nursery Parents – applying for a Reception place for September 2025

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021 start full-time school in September 2025. This first year is called 'Reception'. **Please ensure you apply on-line via your local council before the closing date which is 15th January 2025.**

Applying for a Nursery school place for September 2025

Please apply for a Nursery pack via email.

If your child was born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022 you can apply for 30 hours free Nursery education in a Solihull school starting in September 2025. These applications are now made directly to schools and not via Admissions. St. Anne's application forms will be available from 16th October 2024. To request one, please send your child's name, date of birth and your name and contact number to: nurseryadmissions@st-annes.solihull.sch.uk. Please type 'Nursery 2025' in the subject line so that we can easily identify your email. We will email an application form to you in due course.

Kindly note the closing date for receipt of Nursery 2025 applications is 18th December 2024. All applications and Catholic Baptism certificates must be received in the school office by this date. You will be advised of the outcome of your application by email on 31st January 2025.

Please note that when you apply for a **Nursery** or **Reception** place we follow the Admissions policy and we can only consider your child as Catholic if you have provided a baptismal certificate **before** the closing date for applications. We cannot accept that you intend to get your child baptised, even if the child's siblings are already baptised. Therefore, it is really important that if you are looking to organise a baptism this takes place before the closing dates for admissions.

If you wish your child to be baptised one parent must be a Catholic. If you wish to contact our Parish Priest, his telephone number is 0121 770 3283.

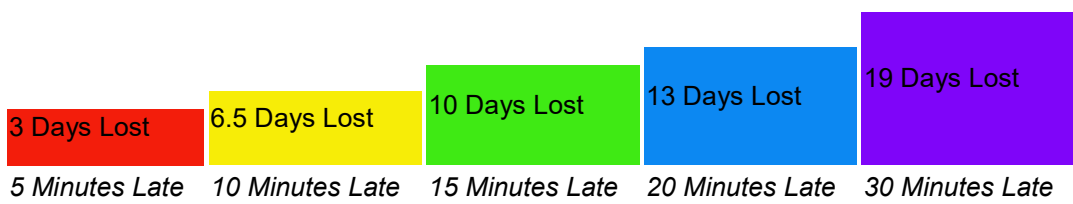
ATTENDANCE

Late marks and Absences

The doors open for children in Reception to Year 6 at 8.30am and close at 8.40am. Children who arrive after this time must go to the School Office where they will be given their late mark. Late marks are monitored and recorded. Children who arrive from 9.10am onwards are marked on the register as a 'U' for unauthorised absence, unless they are absent due to a medical appointment. Children arriving at the School Office prior to 9.10am will receive a late mark, 'L' on the register.

8.40am-9.10am = 'L', which means that your child receives a late mark. We are required to put a reason on the register for children who are late so office staff will always ask for a reason. If it is a personal/confidential reason please just say so; staff will make a note of this.

9.10am and beyond = 'U', which means the morning is recorded as an unauthorised absence.



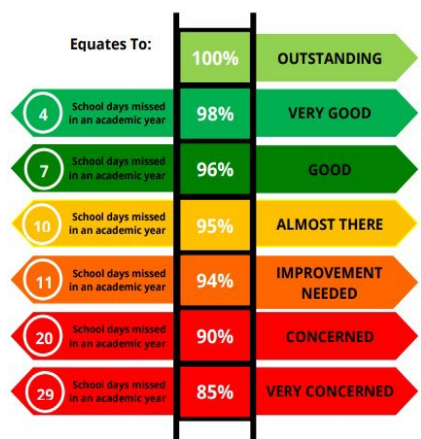

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT



In last week's votes the children answered the following topic question:

Do we know how to appreciate other people's heritage? (7-11)
Can you learn from other people's life stories? (5-7)

Money Twist/ My Bank

Year 5 & 6 are enjoying taking part in a financial education programme, which is designed to help set positive money habits and mind-sets from an early age. This week's session was focused around the theme

'My Future.'

The children found out about the benefits of saving, calculating interest as a reward or charge, and understanding risk. Thinking about personal future endeavours.



The theme for this year is: **Reclaiming Narratives**

This year's theme has a special focus on stories of inspiration about true black heroes and their contributions to society. It has been lovely to see classes combining storytelling and history and highlighting the untold stories and histories of Black people. It is important that we recognise, celebrate and remember the achievements of Black communities locally, nationally and internationally.

October the Month of Mary

October is designated as a month of particular devotion to Mary. It is a powerful time to pray to Mary, the mother of Jesus. Each class focal point has a special focus on Mary and children will be exploring the mysteries of the Rosary and dedicating time to pray the Rosary.



Libraries Week

The chosen theme for this year is sustainability and climate change 'Go Green at the Library this Libraries week'. Our children are so fortunate to have Saint Anne's school library and Chelmsley wood Library on their door step. Years 3, 4,5 have visited Chelmsley wood Library and classes have been paying regular visits to our school Library to promote this special occasion. A careful focus has been given to the role libraries play in our communities with a focus on how libraries support sustainability and combat climate change.

NURSERY

Religious Education

In Religious Education the children have been learning about God the Creator. They listened to the Creation story from the Bible and went on a creation walk to find some of the things that God made.

Physical Education

In PE this week the children played games linked to a pirate theme. They played 'All Aboard the Ship' and 'Jumping the Treasure'. They learnt how to move safely and how to stop with control.

Religious Education

This week we have continued our work on the Creation Story. We enjoyed creating our own pathway retelling the story. We then took turns to tell the story in our own words.



Prayer and Liturgy

We enjoyed creating our own Prayer stones to place in our Prayer garden. We decorated individual stones and are looking forward to placing them around the statue of the Holy Family. We spoke about how we belong to our families at home, our families at school and the family of God.



Maths

In maths we have been exploring and discussing pattern and sorting objects by different criteria. We've looked at patterns on clothing, in the environment and patterns made out of objects. The children have had great fun creating their very own repeating patterns and sorting objects and shapes in different ways.



YEAR 1

Religious Education – Month of the Rosary

As October is the month of the Rosary, we have said the Hail Mary prayer every morning to begin our day. We have looked at the special items on our new blue focal point that represent Our Lady and spoke about their meaning. In addition to saying the Hail Mary each morning, we have sung it and used sign with the help of Dan and Emily from our One Life retreat.



Geography

As geographers this week, we have continued exploring map skills within our local area. Using an aerial view map of St. Anne's school grounds, the children had to locate different letters of the alphabet. Each letter corresponded to an address. They then had to use their navigation skills in order to be able to locate the different letters, they were also challenged to do this in the correct order of the alphabet! They did a wonderful job and really showed their team work!



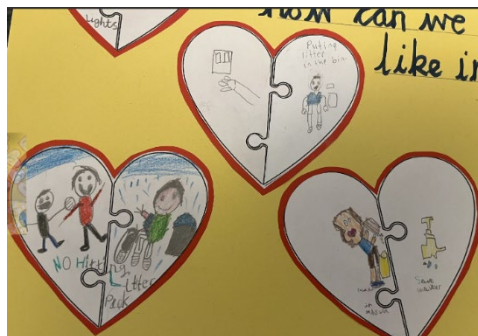
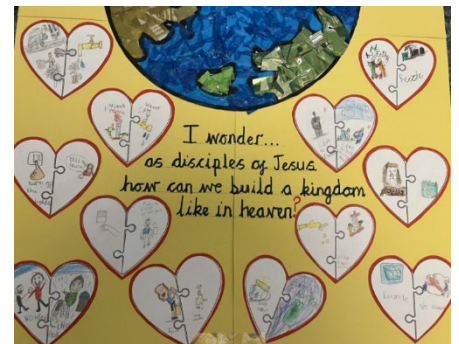
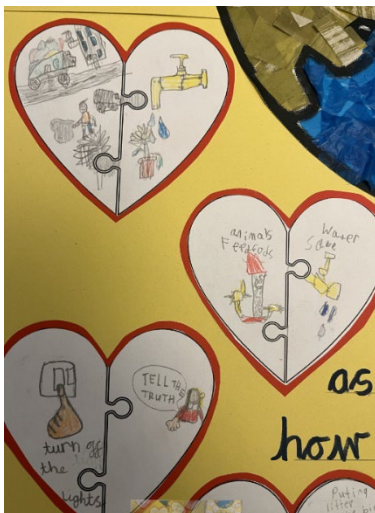


YEAR 2

Religious Education

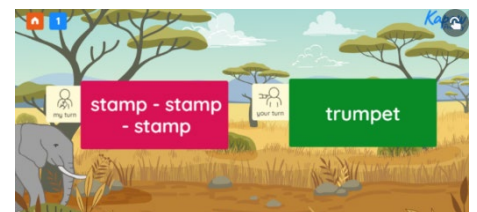
This week in RE, Year 2 have joined together with other schools in our MAC to celebrate 'Our Father Week'. The children have amazed their teachers with their beautiful singing performing 'The Our Father prayer'. They then moved on to learning a certain line of the prayer in more detail. Our Focus was "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Together we discussed how God wants us all to make our Earth as kind, beautiful and caring as in Heaven. We talked about how we should live our lives in a way that reflects the way that Christ lived his. We talked about how we can do the same as God 'Our King' and reveal the kingdom of heaven through our actions each day. We created a piece of artwork linked to this line of the 'Our Father' to show that we can make the world a better place by recycling. Together as a class we collaged a world with recycling materials. We also used our art skills to answer this question,

"I wonder as disciples of Jesus; how can we build a kingdom like in heaven?" Here are some of our ideas.



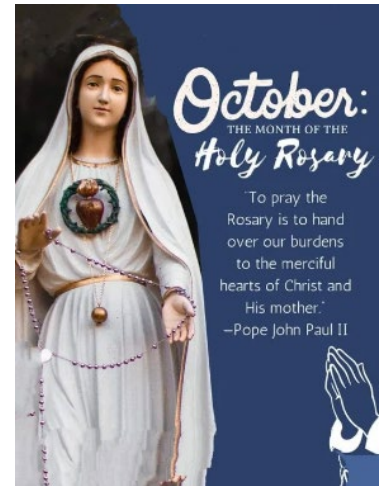
Music- Call and Response

The children have been learning about Call and Response music. We have learnt some rhythms that remind us of animals we might see on safari. This week we have worked in partners. One person has played the call on a percussion instrument and one person played the response.



Prayer and Liturgy

In Prayer and Liturgy this week the children took some time to reflect on the special month of October and highlight the prominence of Our Lady during this time. We prayed a decade of the Rosary together where we started our Rosary Challenge beginning with the 1st Glorious Mystery: The Ascension. Whilst doing so, the children coloured in a bead at a time on a visual representation of the Rosary Beads showing the importance of each prayer that we say: One Our Father, Ten Hail Marys and One Glory Be.



Geography

This week in their topic Villages, Towns and Cities, the children looked at how different Settlements differ. They looked at the differences between a village, town and city and the features that affect this. They also looked at permanent and temporary settlements. The children compiled a list of employment, leisure, shopping and transport in each settlement. To conclude our lesson, we carried out some very important fieldwork deciphering why Chelmsley Wood is considered a town. The children did some great spotting of the local shopping centre, shops and our local church as well as discussing many important features of a Town.



Libraries Week

This week we have been celebrating Libraries Week at St Anne's. This year the theme was 'sustainability and climate change.' The children loved walking to and from the library and sharing books with their friends. We found lots of books linked to the environment and how to be Stewards of God's Creation. We even had the opportunity to explore the Black History Month section and read a story as a class.



Art – Henri Matisse

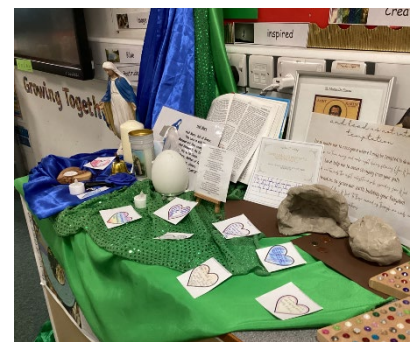
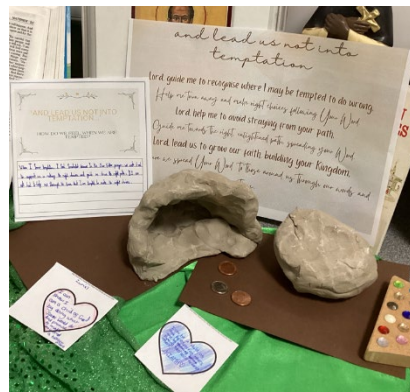
During Art this week the children in Year 4 looked at different aspects of Henri Matisse's work. They worked in groups and looked at some of his most famous pieces. They enjoyed analysing each piece of artwork and answering the questions: What colours do you see? What shapes do you see and what do they remind you of? Do you see any lines in this piece of work? And how do you think Henri Matisse made this? They have developed their knowledge on this artist's technique.



YEAR 5

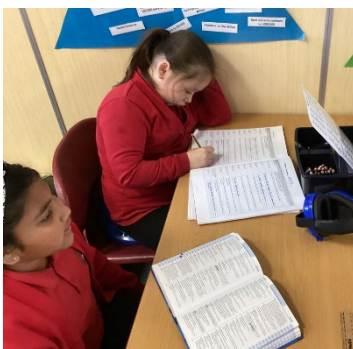
Prayer and Liturgy

In Prayer and Liturgy this week, Year 5 have been thinking about lots of different things. In particular, across our school, we have been thinking about the Our Father prayer. Year 5 were given the line 'and lead us not into temptation' to focus on. One of the things we did was set up the focal point and talk about why we had certain objects placed on it. The rocks represent Jesus' time being tempted in the desert by Satan, and the money links to our recent financial workshops with how we can be tempted by different things in our lives. The children had a wonderful discussion and reflection on how we ask God to guide us down the right path and support us in making the right choices.



Reading

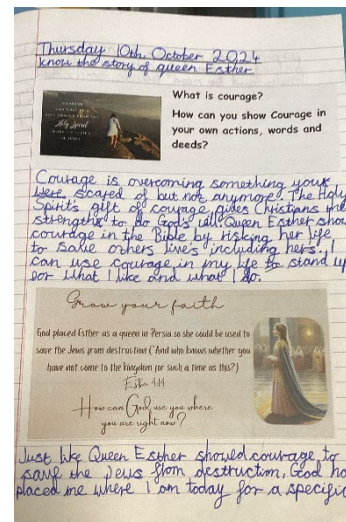
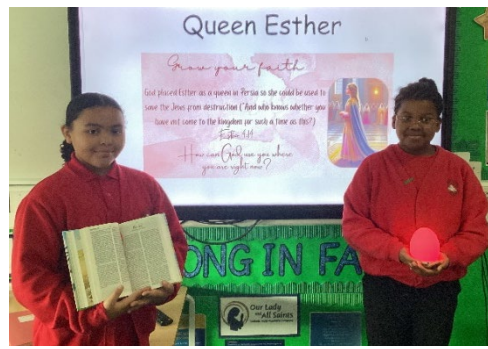
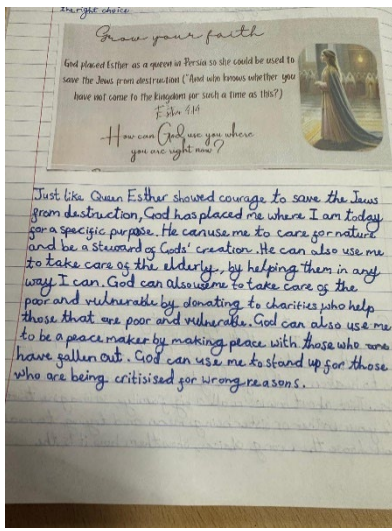
This week, in Reading, Year 5 have been looking at Dorothy Vaughan's biography – a pioneer at NASA. We are looking at Dorothy and her empowerment particularly linked to Black History Month. She is a very important figure in history with a very inspiring story. The children were challenged to find some vocabulary in the dictionary to help us make sense of our non-fiction text. They were absolutely super at using the dictionary and love finding the meaning of new words! Super enthusiasm Year 5!



YEAR 6

Religious Education

To conclude our learning about 'The Story of the People of God', we learned about an inspirational figure in the Bible called Queen Esther. We listened to her story and understood how she showed sheer courage for standing up for her belief and faith. We reflected on how we can learn from this story, showing how God can use us where we are right now to better ourselves, our school family and community and the wider parish.



Art

Today, we learned about Macro-Photography and how artists use this technique to create a particular mood. We found some everyday objects to use the technique on and create some very effective pieces. We then left our photographs on tables and allowed each other to browse the gallery of the class observing what other had achieved.



ONLINE SAFETY TIP OF THE WEEK

Vault (secret) Apps

Have you heard of Vault Apps? They are basically secret apps that are concealed by looking like a normal, less conspicuous app. For example, one of these apps looks and works like a working calculator when opened, but when a passcode is entered, it reveals photographs, videos, documents and contacts. Understanding Autism for Parents and Carers

The SISS Autism Team are pleased to offer a workshop for parents and carers of autistic children.

The workshops use the key elements of the [Autism Education Trust Making Sense of Autism](#) training module that is delivered to all schools in Solihull, developing this knowledge and understanding to meet the needs of the family.

The workshops are delivered by experienced Specialist Advisory Teachers and Inclusion Support Practitioners from the SISS Autism Team. The team are licensed by AET to deliver the training.

The aims of the workshops are to:

- * **Introduce the current understanding of autism and the 3 areas of difference.**
- * **Develop your understanding of your child's individual profile of strengths and support needs.**
- * **Identify a range of strategies that may support your child and wider family.**
- * **Know what support is available in school and develop a shared understanding of the approaches and language to support working together with your child's school.**
- * **Signposting to wider services and offers in our local area.**

You will receive a range of practical resources for use at home following each session, plus a certificate directly from AET upon completion of the workshop.

The workshops are repeated each school term and are delivered in Family Hubs and training venues in North Solihull, Central Solihull, plus one online opportunity. You can choose the option that works best for you – all dates and venues for the whole year are available to book now.
